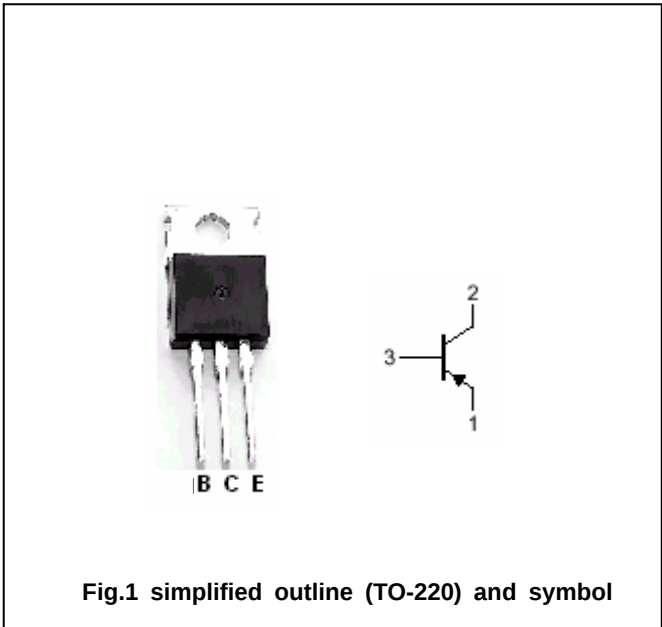


Fig.1 simplified outline (TO-220) and symbol

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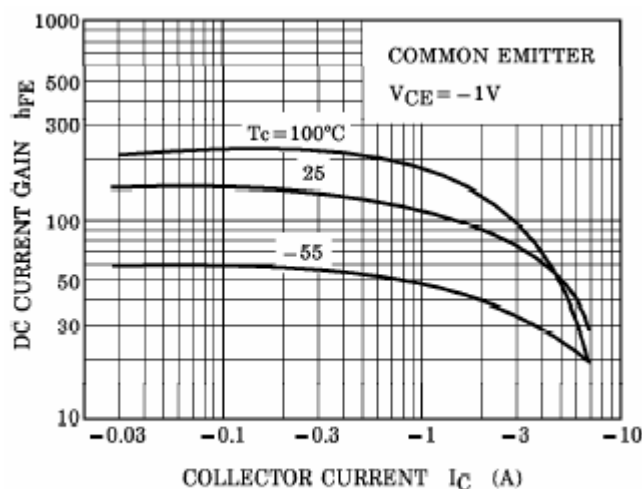


Fig.4 DC current Gain

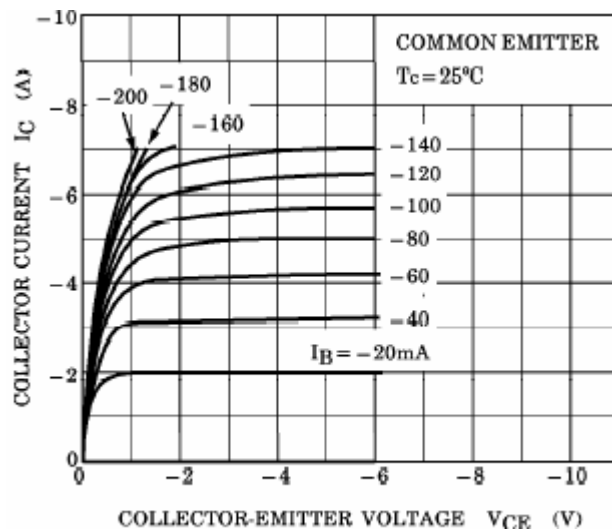


Fig.4 Static Characteristic

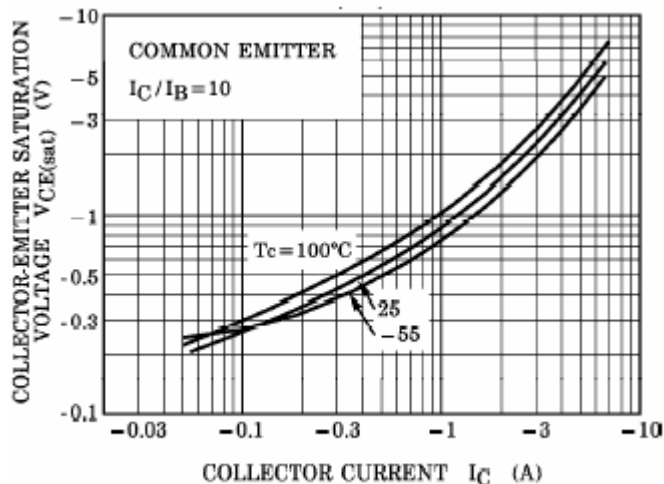


Fig.5 Collector-Emmitter Saturation Voltage

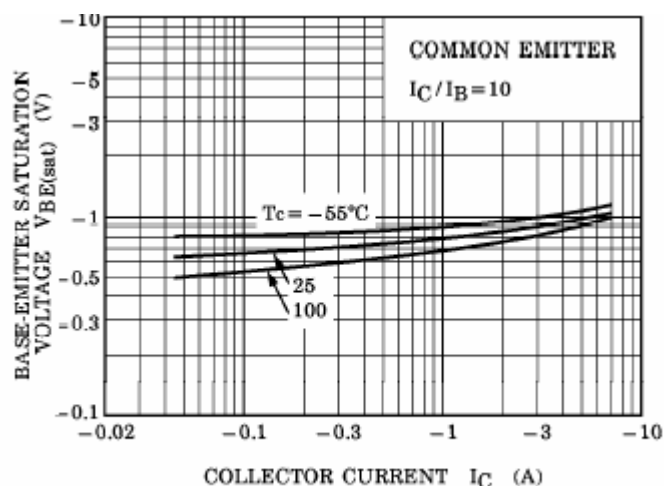


Fig.6 Base-Emmitter Saturation Voltage

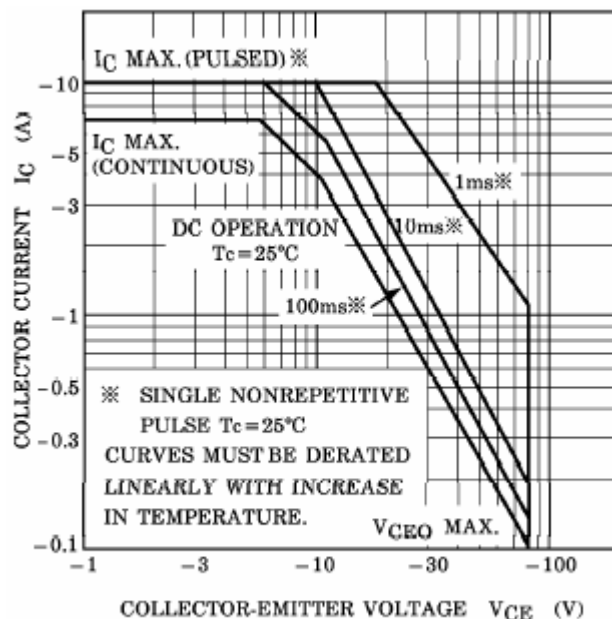


Fig.7 Safe Operating Area
